THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

23 March 2025

The Third Sunday of Lent in Year C invites reflection on God's mercy and the importance of conversion, emphasizing that our lives are a gift and that we should always seek to live in a way that pleases God, especially during this season of Lent. Some themes that can help us reflect on today's readings:

God's Patience and Mercy: The readings highlight God's continued patience and mercy, even when we stray from his path.

Bearing Fruit: The parable of the fig tree in Luke 13: 1-9 highlights the importance of producing good works and actively living out our faith.

God's Patience: The vinedresser's plea to give the tree another chance underscores God's mercy and willingness to offer opportunities for conversion.

Urgency of Conversion: While God is patient, the parable emphasizes that the possibility for conversion is not unlimited, urging us to respond immediately to God's grace. **Looking to Jesus:** In Luke 13:1-9 Jesus asks people to look to him and be changed by his ministry. The kingdom of heaven is at hand and calls for repentance. {Mt 4:17}

Looking to God: The readings encourage us to look and search and find God.

Self- Reflection: Consider what steps we can take to grow closer to God .

Responding to God's Mercy: Make a commitment to responding to God's grace with sincerity and resolve, rather than waiting for a future opportunity.

Give Others a Second Chance: As God is always patient and forgives, we are called to show the same mercy and kindness in our interactions with others. Of course, how we put these suggestions into action will be unique to each of us as sisters and brothers of Jesus. Blessings
