30TH Sunday of Ordinary Time - 27th October

Today's Gospel is one of my favourites, Jesus healing the blind man, Bartimaeus. Some of you will remember the line, "There are none so blind, as those who will not see." We are all blind in various ways – maybe the eyesight struggles of old age, but maybe it's the inability to see Christ in the face of another person, or their needs, or their goodness. Let us cry out with Bartimaeus this day, "Master, I want to see!"

A busy week ahead – Senior Prizegiving and Leavers' Mass at Campion College, All Saints Day and All Souls Day. We wish the senior students from our College well.

We have a beautiful tradition of remembering those who have died, especially in the month of November, and we will do so next Saturday at our 9am Mass. We also remember **Deirdre McGuinness**, whose Requiem was celebrated last Monday, and we pray the Lord's consolation for Paul and the family.

Earlier in the week, I had a lovely chat on the phone with **Sister Maureen Cahill RSJ**, and she wishes to be remembered to everyone. Sister Maureen (85) was the pastoral worker in the parish "back in the day", and now lives near Limerick, in Ireland. God bless her!

We have our emergency evacuation at our Sunday Masses this weekend – please look out for one another, especially the elderly and the vulnerable.

Finally, Labour Day tomorrow, a day to rest from our labours and remember the dignity of work. Have a good day off.


